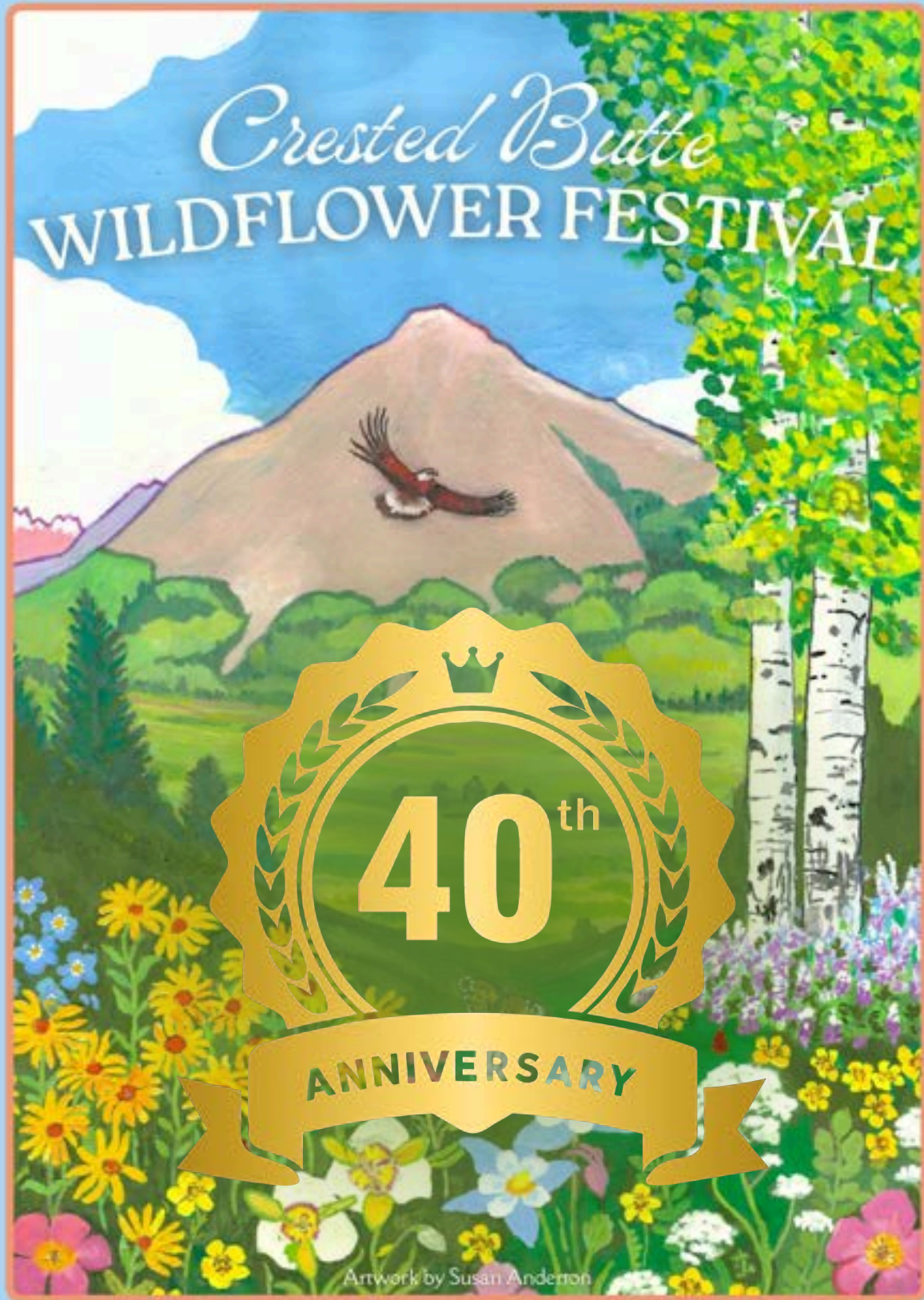

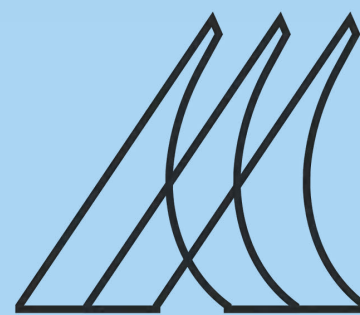

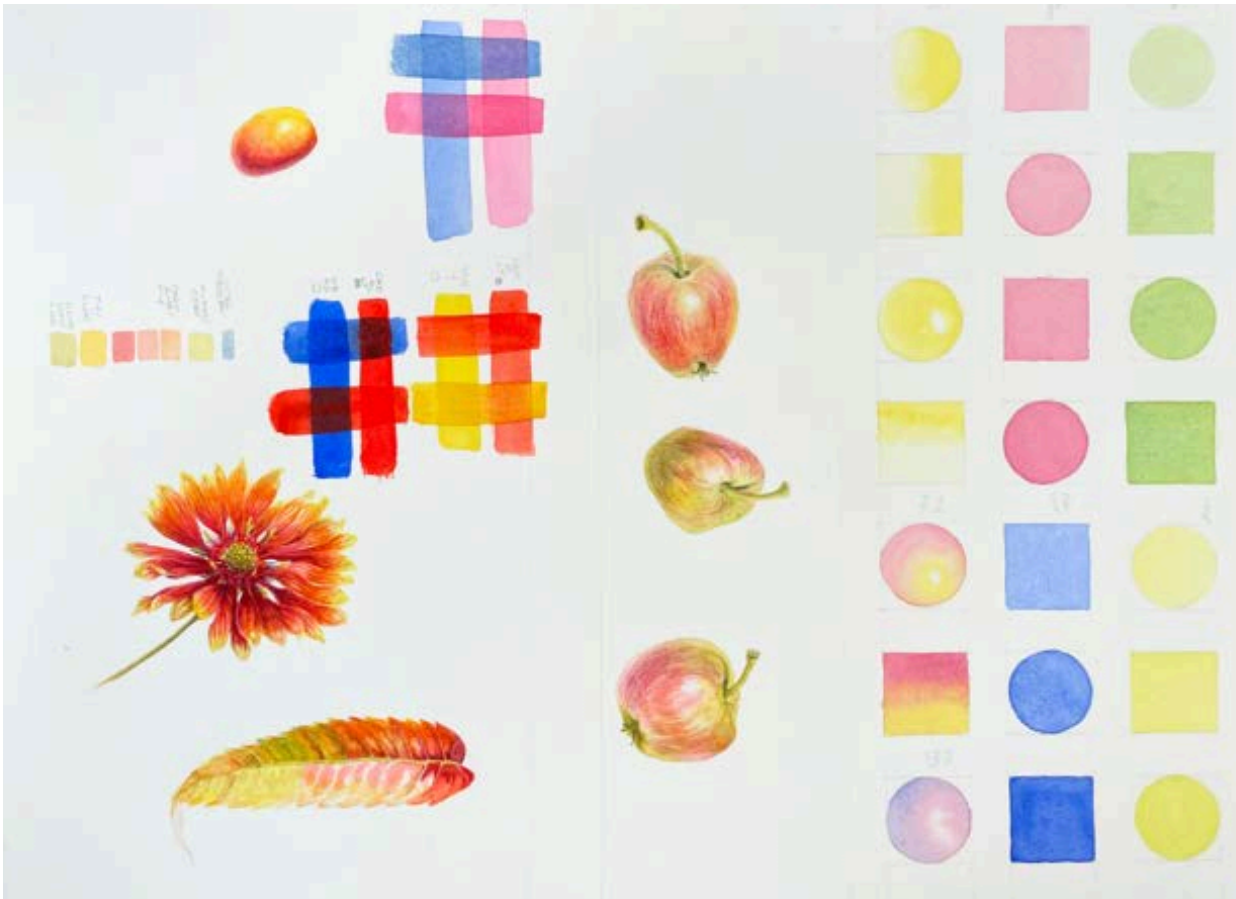

Meet This Year's Poster Artist, Susan Anderton!

Each year, our Festival is marked by the creation of the annual Wildflower Festival Poster. Each poster represents just one of the forty years, yet together they form something larger. Local artist Susan Anderton created the artwork for our first poster in 1987, a limited-edition silkscreen featuring City Hall, as well as columbine, paintbrush, and glacier lily blooms. She created just 80 copies of that original piece, a far cry from the 1,000 copies produced this year for the 40th-anniversary poster, for which we are honored to have her back as our featured artist.

"This was difficult!" remarked Susan in reflection on how she approached the creative process differently for the 40th-anniversary poster, knowing it would sit in conversation with her original work. "I thought about using the same or similar format [as the original]. I do love the noble façade and history of the Old Town Hall, but to use it again would not be appropriate. I wanted to establish a sense of place. The Wildflower Festival is not about the Town. It represents the valley, the trails, the woods, the views, the thrill of coming out of the woods and seeing the valley open up, and everywhere, the glorious flowers in colorful display," she explained. Mission accomplished.

Susan hopes that, decades from now when someone sees this year's 2026 poster, it communicates: "that we cared for and appreciated the beauty of the wildflowers and took measures to protect them, while educating and enriching the experience of visitors and ourselves" during this moment in the Festival's history.

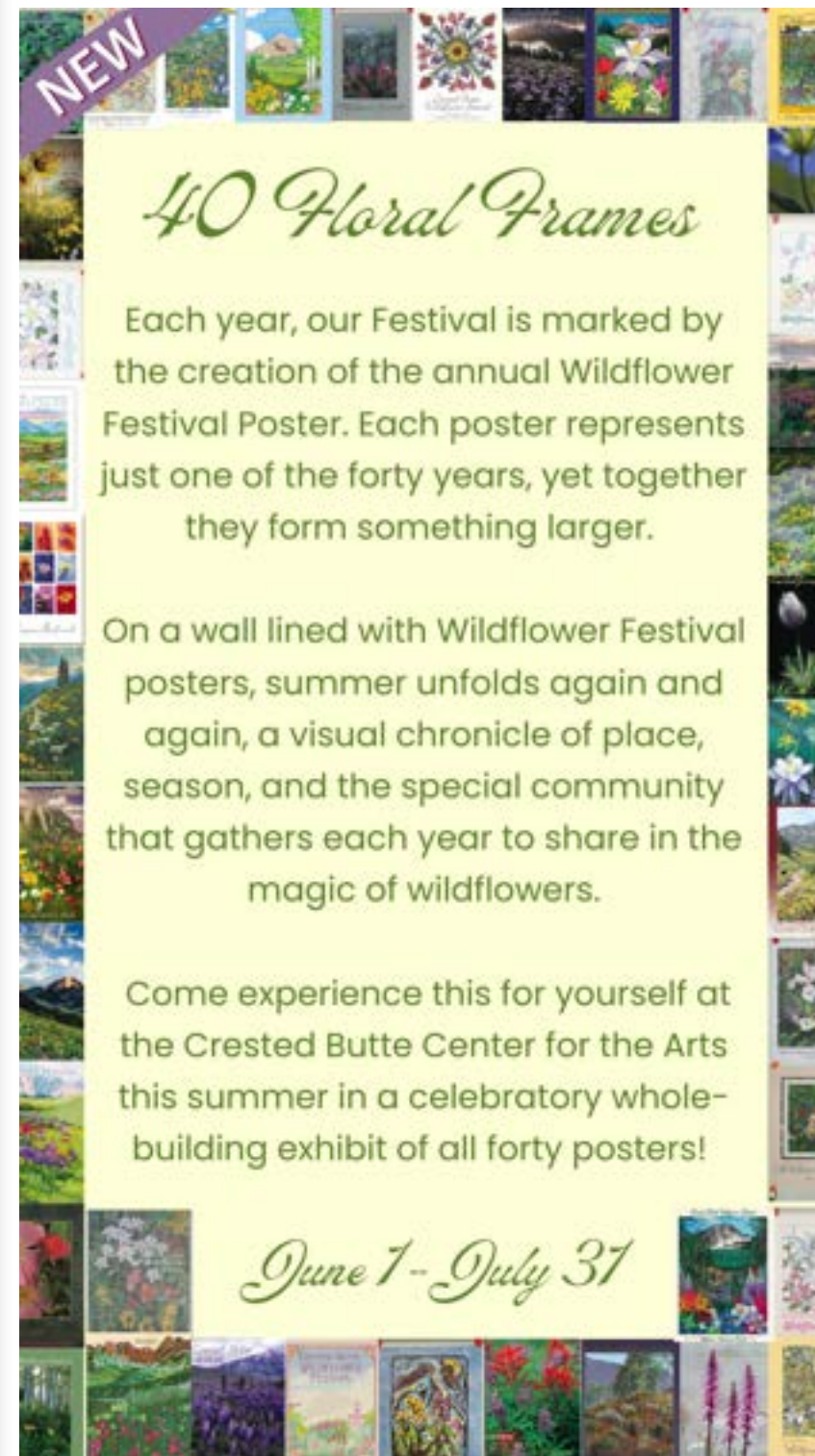

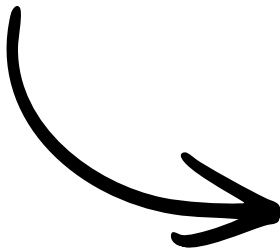

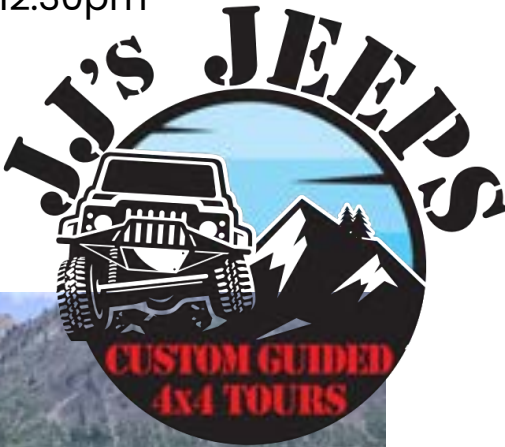

As the enchanted golden Aspen groves of autumn soon cozy up under pristine blankets of sparkling snow, it is remarkable to fathom that the next season's spectacles could possibly measure up to the beauty before it. Contemplating this from the view of a chairlift in 1982 was Rick Reavis, visiting Crested Butte for the first time, chaperoning a youth church ski trip. As he and a fellow lift rider exchanged these musings in warm conversation over the crisp air, a seed of admiration and curiosity was planted.

Enticed by the tales of rainbowed wildflowers and abundant native plants, Tenured Associate Professor of Horticulture at Oklahoma State University, Rick Reavis, planned a trip to Crested Butte that next summer with his wife, Margaret. There, Rick connected with Vinnie Rossignol, who took him "under his wing" and showed him the best trails around the area for wildflower discovery. The seed had been watered.

After this trip, Rick and Margaret would go on to spend their summers in Crested Butte; Rick worked as an interpretive guide at the Weldon and Rosalie Weekley Visitor Center and Store in Gothic, and Margaret served as Treasurer for the Crested Butte Wildflower Festival. It was not long before Rick was convinced by Margaret and the Executive Director at the time, Sue Wallace, to join the Board and eventually serve as President. The seed now budding and blooming, strong and fruitful.

Rick reflects on those early days of the Festival, saying, "I remember many discussions finding ways to bring in new talent, and especially young adults, to the Festival. Always making attempts to expand the interest and success of the Festival while focusing on its future. I recall the Festival's budget being very tight and the Board constantly exploring avenues to generate additional revenues." Thinking about where the Festival is today, Rick shares that he is most proud that the Festival is still around, likening the non-profit to the wildflower "old-man-on-the-mountain, *Hymenoxys grandiflora*." He explains, "the large yellow flowers always face East. It is believed the plant has evolved in this fashion to protect the flower from adverse conditions. Much like the CBWF has survived for four decades."

Since its inception, “stemming from the actions of a few locals who thought it might be a good idea to promote the natural beauty of native wildflowers to a broader audience,” Rick notes the significance of the Festival’s growth both in scope and community impact; “In my experience, CB is a tight-knit, local community. Respect and admiration are not guaranteed for a non-profit organization. It has to be earned over a period of years. The preservation of CBWF’s mission of protecting the ecosystems and educating wildflower hiking participants and guests, CBWF has gained respect in the greater CB community.”

Looking ahead to the future, Rick remarks:

The greatest concern for me is overuse of the wildflower trails, combined with a changing climate. What one experiences today may be increasingly less common in the future. I remember a Board discussion about how the CBWF is not a “Disneyland experience.” I remain optimistic about the future of the CBWF. In general, a strong Board and executive team can adjust the organization in ways to adapt to a changing climate and increased population influence here in CB. The CBWF may appear very different forty years from now. Seriously, who would have thought forty years ago the CBWF would be the non-profit it is today?

To keep this positive momentum going, leaning into the importance of community engagement playing into the stewardship of wild landscapes like ours, he emphasizes, “It’s all about community education. Especially the CB natural history. We have a unique opportunity to learn from the scientific research findings of RMBL. The recent partnership between CBWF and RMBL will provide opportunities for a better understanding of CB’s stewardship of our outdoor landscapes.”

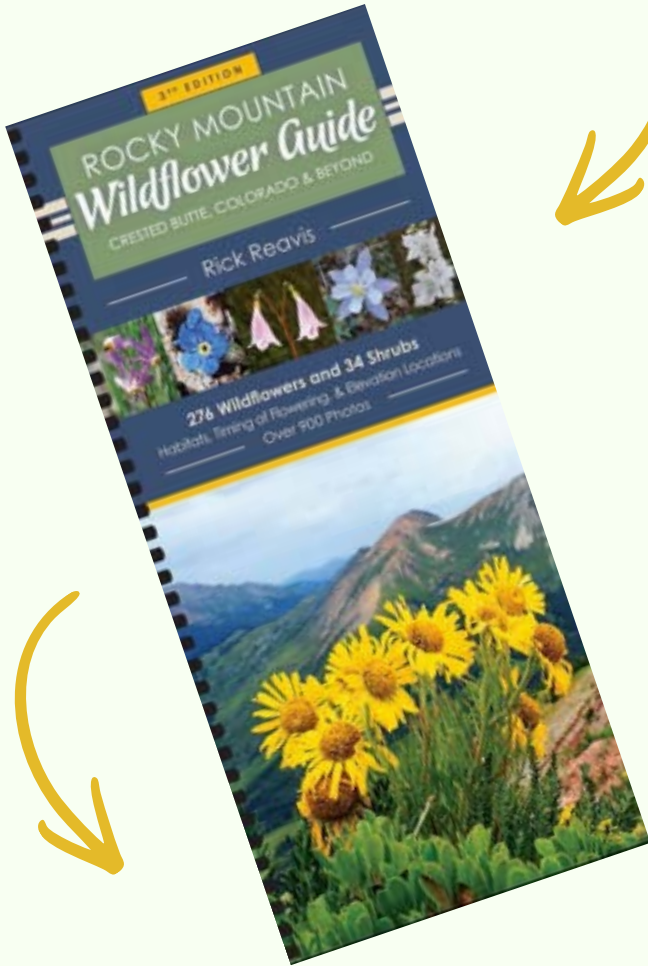
For over forty years, Rick has been working hard to do just that, educating folks both directly and indirectly about our local wildflower populations and ecosystems. Since serving on the Board, Rick has continued to stay involved with the Festival, dedicating his time as an event Leader and running training sessions with other Festival Leaders on wildflower identification. Rick is also the author of the Rocky Mountain Wildflower Guide, now in its 4th edition (coming soon). He smiles:

Seeing a new guide’s enthusiasm of discovery and then passing on their insights is one of the greatest rewards for a teacher. Essentially, being able to witness my replacements is what it’s all about for me. I have been so very blessed to have been able to be part of the CB botanical community. I have lifelong friendships that were created out of identifying plants on the trails. It is through CBWF that I was first introduced to RMBL. My family has grown up learning about the outdoor environment because of these relationships. I will always keep attempting to learn and share as long as it’s possible.

For someone attending the Festival for the first time, especially those eager to plant their own seeds of curiosity and appreciation of wildflowers and nature, Rick’s biggest piece of advice is simple: “Don’t make it a ‘one and done’ occurrence! Stay as long as possible and come back for years to come. I have been identifying plants in the area for over forty years and still become amazed at what is out there to discover and learn.” He also recommends keeping an eye out for Moss Campion, Fireweed, and Twinflower, all examples of wildflowers with a circumboreal distribution. He says, “These CB wildflowers are like glacial relics!”

To learn more about what makes these flowers so impressive, or why snowpack can make or break a wildflower season, we highly recommend joining one of Rick’s events this summer (Follow the Bloom, Gothic Townsite Tour, or Hidden Blooms of Baxter Gulch) and join us in thanking him for all that he means to the Festival.

Beginner Hikes & Walks

Beginner walks/hikes are generally suitable for most people who can walk at a leisurely pace of 2 miles/hour. These hikes are level, with some rolling terrain, and utilize wider, well-packed trails and Jeep roads. Keep in mind that the altitude here in Crested Butte can often make these hikes feel more challenging than their counterparts at sea level. Plan to travel 2-4 miles with up to 500 feet of elevation gain/loss. Wear sturdy walking/hiking shoes (NO flip flops or sandals!). Bring sunscreen, bug spray, snacks, and carry at least 16 ounces of water. Children ages 12+ welcome with supervision.

Intermediate Hikes

Intermediate hikes are suitable for people who consider themselves fit and who participate in jogging/walking/hiking activities on a regular basis. You should be able to comfortably travel at a pace of 2-3 miles/hour. Plan on traveling 3-6 miles on narrower, packed, and rocky trails with some uneven footing. These events traverse steeper terrain, with 500-1000 feet of elevation gain/loss (steep!). Wear sturdy hiking shoes/boots (NOT tennis shoes), and bring sunscreen and bug spray. Bring at least 32 ounces of water and a snack (or lunch if the event is around noon). Rain jacket required. Hiking poles recommended. Children 15+ welcome with supervision.

Three Lakes Hike

Advanced & Expert Hikes

Expert hikes are suitable for people who are very physically fit and regularly incorporate running, cycling, or other strenuous exercise into their schedules. You should be comfortable traveling at a pace of 3 miles/hour...uphill! Plan on traveling 5-8 miles (or more) on steep, often rocky terrain, and expect some off-trail hiking across talus slopes. Footing can be challenging, and many of these hikes feature creek/river crossings and sections that are narrow and exposed to cliffs/drop-offs. Elevation gain/loss can exceed 1,500 vertical feet (very steep!). These hikes are not suitable for anyone with medical conditions that prevent them from exerting themselves or a history of altitude sickness when traveling to mountain areas. Sturdy hiking BOOTS, complete rain gear (jacket & pants), sunscreen, bug spray, hat, 2 liters of water, and substantial snacks and lunch required. Hiking poles recommended. Read event descriptions carefully to learn if sandals/river shoes are required. If you have traveled to Crested Butte from sea level, it is recommended that you spend at least 24 hours in Crested Butte prior to your event departure time to acclimate to the altitude change.



Hidden Blooms of Baxter Gulch

This new classic trail took eight years of construction and is a new gem in the mix of trails close to the Town of Crested Butte. You'll ascend through aspen forest then traverse across southern slopes filled with mules ear, aspen sunflower, and lupine. A descent to the creek marks the turn-around point, or if time permits, ascend the wooded slopes on the other side and search for the elusive fairy slipper.

Cliff Creek’s Summer Garden offers a wildflower hike along the famous Beckwith Pass Trail, a route known for its rich diversity of blooms and sweeping views of the Ruby Range. The trail climbs gradually, with several short, steeper sections, making it well-suited for an observant pace. Along the way, we will pause often to explore the distinctive characteristics of plant families, examine flower anatomy, and discuss a special wildflower that can only be found on this side of Crested Butte. This outing emphasizes careful looking, shared discovery, and time to enjoy the landscape at the height of the summer bloom. ***Please note:*** event time includes 35-min drive to the trailhead.

The meadows between Lost Lake and Beckwith Pass are filled with prime examples of Case’s Corydalis , Oshá, and Corn Lily, wildflowers said to be emblematic of the West Elk mountains. Enjoy these species along with numerous other montane flowers along with excellent views of Marcelina Mountain, the Beckwith Mountains, the Ruby Range, and the Dyke Trail. ***Please note:*** *event time includes a 35-min drive to the trailhead; we will drop cars at Horse Ranch Park and carpool to Lost Lake, then reverse at the end. Please plan on using your vehicle.*

The views include six 14,000-ft peaks and one of the most abundant and diverse displays of wildflowers in the Gunnison Valley, often featuring masses of alpine sunflowers.

From the Crested Butte side of the Elk Range, we'll ascend West Maroon Pass, cross the Elk Mountain Divide, then descend beneath the dramatic flanks of Maroon Bells and Pyramid Peak. This hike is easily Colorado's most spectacular wildflower adventure – the combination of lush vegetation, alpine tundra, and colorful geology is unrivaled. Transportation to the trailhead and from Aspen back to Crested Butte is included. We'll grab a "to-go" meal (meal not included) on the return to Crested Butte via shuttle.
